Duration: 45 min

Aim: raise the awareness on the issue of trafficking in human beings

Objectives:

- make the issue of trafficking in human beings actual for young people
- provide information about the recruitment methods of traffickers in Belarus
- provide information and develop skills on safe migration
- whom to address for more information or in case of required assistance

Outline:

2. Getting to know each other (Name, what country would you like to visit, what would you take with you when going for a trip to foreign country?)
3. Group contract – agreement on the norms of work (turn off the sound on the mobile phones, not to criticize one's opinion, active listening, etc.)
4. What is trafficking – notion (interactive discussion on the notion, presenting the notion in accordance with the international documents, different forms of exploitation, some figures on cases of trafficking in the world and in Belarus)

Safe migration skills (method “Make a pair”, each participant gets a part of sentence with the rule of safe migration, each person has to complete a sentence looking for a person in the group who has the 2<sup>nd</sup> part of the statement, after that young people comment on the safe migration rule that they have)
